Resolutions on the situation in Tunisia

The Pan-African Parliament,

ENCOURAGED by the re-building of the democratic and governance architecture of the Republic of Tunisia;

FURTHER CONCERNED by the urgent need for Tunisia to get back to Constitutional Government;

NOTING that Tunisia is a full member of the Pan-African Parliament;

CONSIDERING its objective of promoting peace and security in Africa;

RECALLING it important role in the democratization process in Tunisia;

THEREFORE RESOLVES:

- 1. To assist Tunisia in its endeavour to achieve democratic governance and the respect of Human Rights for its citizens;
- 2. To send a pre and post election Mission for the 23 October 2011 election.
