The Council of Ministers,

MINDFUL of Articles 10, 11 and 12 of the treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and defining its composition and functions;

MINDFUL of Article 32 of the Treaty relating to cooperation in transport, communications and tourism;

MINDFUL of Decision A/DEC.20/5/80 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government dated 29th May 1980 relating to the Community Transport Programme;

MINDFUL of Decision C/DEC.8/12/88 of the Council of Ministers on the second phase of ECOWAS road projects relating to interconnecting roads for the opening up of the land-locked countries;

CONSIDERING Article 3 of Convention A/P2/5/82 regulating Inter-State Road Transportation between ECOWAS Member States which states that the list of inter-State road axs is provisional and may be modified by Council of Ministers upon the recommendation of the Transport Commission;

ON THE RECOMMENDATION of the Transport, Communications and Tourism Commission which met in Cotonou from 25 to 27 July 2001;

ENACTS

Article 1

The following roads are hereby approved as part of the Community road axs:

Article 3

This Regulation shall be published in the Official Journal of the Community within thirty (30) days of its signature by the Chairman of Council, it shall be published by each Member State in its National *Gazette* within the same time-frame.
